Why is it important to get vaccinated?

Protect yourself, your loved ones and your community

With flu and COVID-19 claiming thousands of lives each year, it's more important than ever to get vaccinated. Both flu and COVID-19 vaccinations protect you against severe illness and death.

You can visit an in-network doctor or pharmacy for your COVID-19 shot and your flu shot at the same time.

COVID-19 vaccine recommendation: The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends COVID-19 primary series vaccines for everyone ages 6 months and older, and COVID-19 boosters for everyone ages 5 years and older, if eligible. Even if you've already had COVID-19, it's still critical to get vaccinated to boost your immunity.

Flu vaccine recommendation: The CDC recommends annual flu shots for everyone 6 months and older, with rare exceptions. Flu vaccination has important benefits. It can reduce flu illnesses, doctors' visits, and missed work and school; it can also prevent hospitalizations and deaths.

Vaccination is particularly important for people with high risk of serious complications from flu, including pregnant people and people with certain chronic health conditions. People 65 and older should receive a higher-dose flu vaccine, such as Fluzone High Dose, Flublok recombinant or Fludax, rather than standard-dose vaccines.
